Breaking free from an abusive relationship is difficult at best and in the most dire situations can lead to severe injury and even death. In 2022, Harmony House worked with hundreds of survivors to assist them in the process of leaving.

Harmony House is working to break down the barriers that stand in the way of living a life free from abuse. While the dynamics of domestic violence are often similar, each client and situation is unique. Our advocates and case managers work with each individual, providing access to the resources they need. For some this is housing, for others it is assistance finding daycare and employment, and for others access to legal services is most critical. Harmony House has been providing shelter, advocacy and education since 1976 and remains committed to the principal that all individuals have the right to a life free of abuse.

Full Frame Initiative

Harmony House adopted a new approach to working with people facing multiple and complex challenges that focuses on overall wellbeing and supports lasting change. Individuals and families living at the intersection of poverty, trauma, violence, and oppression face constant threats to their wellbeing. The Full Frame Initiative works to maximize wellbeing while minimizing the tradeoffs that must be made with each decision. 2022 marks the first full year of FFI and has produced increased wellbeing, healing, and sustainable change for our clients.

Prevention Education




